Allyson actively treats children with communication and feeding disorders through Speech Paths. In addition, she takes interest in each family served in this practice by personally speaking with each parent when they inquire about services for their child. She takes the time to understand the concerns of the family and the needs of the child in order to effectively coordinate treatment. The child's needs are discussed with Speech Path's clinicians to determine who among them has the clinical expertise, treatment style and availability best suited for each child. Once the speech-language pathologist is identified, an intake packet that includes biographical information about the clinician is sent to the family. The clinician contacts each family directly to get acquainted and to schedule appointments.

She holds a Master of Science degree in Education and Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCC) from the American Speech Language Hearing Association.
